

VOUS VOYAGEZ VERS LE NUNAVIK ? CERTAINES RESTRICTIONS S'APPLIQUENT.

Jusqu'à nouvel ordre, les passagers voyageant à destination du Nunavik doivent obtenir, avant le départ, une autorisation d'accès au territoire du Nunavik (NTAA) délivrée par les autorités régionales du Nunavik et présenter un résultat de test de dépistage de COVID-19 négatif. Les passagers ne présentant pas de NTAA valide à l'enregistrement se verront refuser le droit de voyager.

Cette condition de voyage est conforme à une ordonnance émise par la Directrice régionale de la santé publique du Nunavik.

En outre, veuillez noter que de nouvelles restrictions ont été émises par la Régie régionale de la santé et des services sociaux du Nunavik pour les voyageurs voyageant entre le 9 janvier et le 8 février 2021. Voir l'ordonnance à l'Annexe A.

YOU ARE TRAVELING TO NUNAVIK? CERTAIN RESTRICTIONS APPLY.

Until further notice, all passengers traveling to Nunavik must obtain, prior to departure, a Nunavik Territory Access Authorization (NTAA) issued by the Nunavik Regional Authorities and present a negative COVID-19 test result. Details can be found on the [Nunavik Regional Board of Health and Social Services](#).

Passengers who fail to present a valid NTAA at check-in will not be allowed to travel.

This travel condition is pursuant to an Ordinance issued by the Nunavik Regional Director of Public health

Additionally, please note that new restrictions have been published by the Nunavik Regional Board of Health and Social Services for passengers travelling between January 9 and February 8, 2021. See the ordinance in Appendix A.

Ordinance 2021-01

Date: January 8, 2021

Subject: New Restrictions on travels to Nunavik

Considering the COVID-19 situation in the province;

Considering the exemption accorded to the region from the confinement measures announced by the Government on January 6, 2021;

The Regional Director of Public Health, as per section 106 of the Public Health Act, and the Director of Public Security of Nunavik, as per a Civil Protection Act, put in place additional restrictions for travels to reduce the risk of spreading of COVID-19 in Nunavik.

From January 9 to February 8, 2021, only those categories of people are allowed to travel from outside the region to Nunavik conditional on obtaining a Nunavik Territory Authorization Access:

- Those who have their principal residence in the region;
- Those who are non-resident beneficiaries (and their dependents) who have family ties in Nunavik;
- Those whose travel is necessary to obtain care or services required by their state of health;
- Those whose travel is necessary to provide essential services in the education, public safety, justice, health, social services, daycare and municipal sectors;
- those who work or practice their profession in local businesses or public, para-public and community organizations in the region;
- Those who work or exercise their profession on behalf of a construction company or a telecom company insofar as the work to be performed is essential. Essential work is work which, if not carried out, endangers the health or safety of the population or which endangers the integrity of an infrastructure and/or systems;
- Those whose travel is necessary for humanitarian purposes;
- Those who commercially transport goods or people in the region;

- Those who must travel to the region to comply with an order contained in a court judgment.

Shall there be any change to the current public health situation in Nunavik, the regional Director of Public Health and the Director of Public Security could issue more restrictive directives.
